Saint Joseph: Sharon Hall

St Joseph's principal feast day is March 19. In the New Testament, referred to as Jesus' earthly father and The Virgin Mary's husband. St Joseph is the patron of the universal church in Roman Catholicism and his life is recorded in the Gospels, particularly Matthew and Luke.

We know he was a carpenter. Despite his humble work and means, Joseph came from a royal lineage, and is thought to be a descendant of David, the greatest King of Israel. Indeed, the angel who first tells Joseph about the coming of the unborn Jesus greets him as "son of David". Joseph did as the angel told him and took Mary as his wife because "what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit". The Angel came to Joseph in a dream to foretell "she would give birth to a son whom he would name Jesus, who would save his people from their sins".

Since Joseph does not appear in Jesus' public life, at his death or his resurrection, many historians believe Joseph probably had died before Jesus entered public ministry.

Fun Fact: Many places and churches all over the world are named after St Joseph including the Spanish form, San Jose
